The Origin of Pandas from Scientific Creationism:

"[A]ll the kingdoms, phyla and classes in the organic world have been essentially unchanged since life began, and . . . even the orders and most of the families, genera, and even species appear suddenly in the fossil record, with no incipient forms leading up to them. . . [W]hile there may have been changes within the kinds (as provided by creative forethought) [*i.e.*, a designer] . . . the kinds have apparently not varied since the beginning, except for those that have become extinct." (Henry Morris, *Scientific Creationism*, 1974, pp. 87–88)

"... some organisms appear with adaptational packages intact at the Cambrian boundary where multicellular life first "flowers," with no evidence whatsoever of fossil ancestors. ... only an intelligent designer has the ability to coordinate the design requirements of multifunctional adaptational packages."
